It's been said there are 100 adventures to embark upon in the South Cariboo.

Nestled on the Fraser Plateau between the Coastal and Rocky Mountain ranges, the South Cariboo is renowned as an outdoor recreational paradise, with vast forests, pristine lakes, accessible trails and majestic mountains. It's a region that is as rich in history as it is adventure.

Home to the Tsq̓ésceñ (Canim Lake) First Nation for thousands of years, the area gets its name from the once-abundant caribou herds in the area. In the 1800s, the area was overrun by gold-seekers travelling the Cariboo Waggon Road from Lillooet to Barkerville.

As they needed a place to stop on the long journey, roadhouses were built as supply points. Each roadhouse, such as 70 Mile and 100 Mile House, was

named for the distance it was from Lillooet (Mile 0).

One of those humble roadhouses has since grown into the thriving community of 100 Mile House, the regional hub of the South Cariboo. From 100 Mile House, residents and visitors alike have easy access to a dozen outlying communities home to thousands of friendly people. It's a gateway not only to the South Cariboo, but also to adventure.

In this guide, we have curated a list of 100 different ideas, events and activities that you could incorporate into your own South Cariboo adventure. Whether you're here for only a day trip or an entire month, we welcome you to take a drive, take a dip in one of our many beautiful lakes, enjoy a little rural hospitality and choose your own adventure.

There may not be gold in our hills, but there certainly are tons of adventures to be found.

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# 100 MILE HOUSE

Originally established during the Cariboo Gold Rush, 100 Mile House is named after a roadhouse once located by Bridge Creek. Located 100 miles from Lillooet, the roadhouse's humble name stuck even as the Gold Rush ended and ranchers began making the surrounding region their home.

100 Mile House remained a humble hamlet until Lord Martin Cecil, the 7th Marquess of Exeter, made it his home. Cecil owned and operated the Bridge Creek Ranch the hayfields of which 100 Mile House was later built upon. Today, 100 Mile House has grown to a town of 2,000 strong, which serves up to 20,000 additional people in surrounding communities. With a wide range of locally owned restaurants, businesses and services, it is the perfect home base for those looking to explore the beauty of the South Cariboo.

## 1. SOUTH CARIBOO VISITOR CENTRE

The South Cariboo Visitor Centre at 155 Wrangler Way in 100 Mile House, should be your first stop when visiting the area. Keep an eye out for the world's tallest skis on display outside the cozy log building, or the original B.C. Express Stagecoach No. 14 - the only surviving coach of the Barnard Express and Stage Line, which travelled between Ashcroft and Prince George as late as 1917.

The Visitor Centre is the home to a historic marker that denotes the 100th mile of the Cariboo Waggon Road. It's also located right on the 100 Mile Marsh and features seasonal outdoor washrooms, picnic tables and a beautiful walk around a wetland full of waterfowl during the summer.

## 2. BIRCH AVENUE SHOPPING/DINING

100 Mile House is home to a variety of unique stores for every need - from flooring to books, art supplies, clothing, auto parts and hardware. On Birch Avenue in downtown 100 Mile House, visitors can enjoy an abundance of locally sourced goods from hand-made items to some of the freshest produce in the region, providing a unique homegrown shopping experience.

## 3. SOUTH CARIBOO FARMERS MARKET

During the spring, summer and fall, local artisans, farmers and community groups gather every Friday outside the 100 Mile House Community Hall for the South Cariboo Farmers Market. Open between 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. the farmers market is a great place to get some fresh produce or a unique South Cariboo souvenir. This year, the market runs from May to October.

#### 4. CARIBOO REGIONAL DISTRICT LIBRARY

Those looking to read a good book, do some research or connect to the internet can do so at the Cariboo Regional District Library 100 Mile House Branch. A striking log building located at 449 Birch Avenue, the library also offers summer reading programs and general programming for children.

#### 5. MURAL WALK

100 Mile House's history isn't just in the pages of the book; it's painted onto the very walls of the town. Anyone looking to explore the town on foot should keep an eye out for the 16 murals scattered around town depicting the stories of early settlers and more recent local history.

#### 6. 100 MILE MARSH

Park at the South Cariboo Visitor Centre and enjoy this 1.5 km walk around the 100 Mile Marsh. The marsh walk is a low-mobility trail full of wildlife viewing opportunities. Signs along the trail provide a bird's eye view of the bird life that can be seen in the marsh.

## 7. CENTENNIAL PARK

In 100 Mile House, Centennial Park is a beautiful place to stop for a picnic or a stroll around the banks of Bridge Creek. Those looking for a short five to 10-minute hike can make their way towards the Bridge Creek Falls just off the parking lot.

The path meanders along Bridge Creek, sheltered by beautiful pine and fir trees. During the summer, you'll see squirrels, waterfowl and songbirds who make the area their home.

Bridge Creek Falls itself is a majestic sight, its gentle roar providing the perfect place to sit and meditate on life. The trail carries on past Bridge Creek to Sawmill Creek Bridge, following the path of Bridge Creek.

## 8. SOUTH CARIBOO REC CENTRE

The hub for ice sports, conventions and summer camps, the South Cariboo Rec Centre is one of 100 Mile House's greatest assets. During the winter, it hosts regular hockey games and free skate opportunities, while during the rest of the year, it can provide a venue for concerts, powwows, fairs and conventions.

## 9. 100 MILE WRANGLERS

During the hockey season, 100 Mile House shows up in force to support the 100 Mile House Wranglers, the town's Junior A Hockey team. Competing in the Kootenay International Junior Hockey League, the Wranglers provide exciting, high-level hockey for the community to enjoy.

## 10. 100 MILE AND DISTRICT OUTRIDERS CLUB

Beside the South Cariboo Rec Centre is the grounds of the 100 Mile and District Outriders Club. This venerable rodeo ground has seen generations of South Cariboo cowboys and cowgirls practice their trade. Today, the Outriders host several barrel racing, gymkhanas and other events that are open to the public to attend.

## 11. LOGAN PARENT BULLS AND BARRELS

For the last five years, the Logan Parent Bulls and Barrels has been hosted at the 100 Mile Outriders Grounds. Held in memory of 100 Mile bullrider Logan Parent, the event is a chance to watch high-quality bullriding and barrel racing, while raising money for concussion awareness. This year's rodeo takes place on June 12 and 13th.

## 12. 100 MILE CURLING CLUB

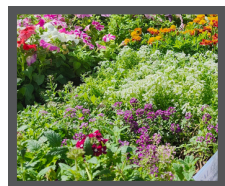
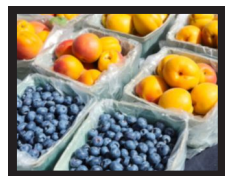
The 100 Mile House Curling Club runs various leagues throughout the season as well as four bonspiels a year, including mixed doubles, ladies, mens' and mixed curling action. The rink has a licensed lounge upstairs where you can watch the bonspiel competitions while grilling the locals about the area. The club welcomes out-of-town competitors and visitors.

## 13. BC ALE TRAIL

New this year, the BC Ale Trail has come to 100 Mile House. Those looking to enjoy a good drink can swing by the Cask and Cleaver, 100 Mile House's local brewery with a Viking twist. In addition to several unique ales and beers, the Cask and Cleaver offers tasty pub food and expanded patio seating.

## 14. HOT JULY NIGHTS

100 Mile House's largest summer event is Hot July Nights, a massive car show that attracts attendees from across B.C. and beyond. Scheduled for July 17 to 19 this summer, the show typically consists of rod runs, poker runs and other car show favourites. Hot July Nights culminates on Sunday with a Show and Shine all along Birch Avenue.



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## 15. LOCAL ART GALLERIES

There is something about the South Cariboo that attracts and fosters artists of all kinds. Their works can be found in galleries and coffee shops across 100 Mile House. The South Cariboo Business Centre hosts the Showcase Art Gallery, a small rotating gallery maintained by the Cariboo Artists' Guild. Parkside Art Gallery, meanwhile, hosts a dozen shows each year featuring local and regional artists, with an attached gift shop selling arts and crafts.

## 16. PARKS ALIVE SUMMER MUSIC SERIES

Every summer on lazy Friday evenings, Centennial Park comes alive with the sound of music. Organised by RE/MAX 100, the Parks Alive Summer Music Series brings musical acts from across B.C. to the stage in Centennial Park for the community to enjoy for free. This year's series is set to run from July 10 to Aug. 28 from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. each Friday.

## 17. MARTIN EXETER HALL

One of 100 Mile House's oldest buildings, Martin Exeter Hall was originally built as a television studio for the Emissaries of Divine Light. Today, it serves as the town's hub for live theatre performances put on by the 100 Mile Performing Arts Society and a concert venue for local choirs and bands.



## 18. SOUTH CARIBOO THEATRE

If you're looking to catch a movie in 100 Mile House, the family-owned and operated South Cariboo Theatre is the place to go. Its cozy atmosphere and comfortable seating provide an intimate movie-going experience.

## 19. 100 MILE NORDICS

The 100 Mile House Nordics Ski Society operates 45 kilometres of trail, with 2.5 kilometres of that being lit, in the 99 Mile Recreation Area. A lodge, with ski and snowshoe rentals and scrumptious lunches, is also open until 4 p.m. each day. For those who don't ski, there are snowshoe trails and an adventure park for younger kids to explore, while the club also hosts programs and events open to visitors.



## 20. 99 MILE LOW MOBILITY TRIAL

Located on Ainsworth Road just south of 100 Mile House, the 99 Mile Low Mobility Trail is a 1.7-kilometre-long route with a gentle grade. It winds through a verdant mountain forest and features four main viewpoints, including a wetland and a commanding view of 100 Mile House and Stephenson Lake below.

During the winter, this trail is part of the 100 Mile House Nordic Ski Society's ski and snowshoeing trails. There are several picnic tables and benches scattered across the trail, which ends at the Nordic's Beanstalk Cabin. There, hikers will find the cabin, a fire pit, an accessible outhouse and a picnic table.

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## 21. HUNCITY MOUNTAIN BIKING CLUB

Whether you're after rugged terrain or accessible trails, mountain bikers can find what they're looking for in the South Cariboo. The Huncity Mountain Bike Club is a small but mighty club that has developed a diverse number of trails at 99 Mile Recreation Area in 100 Mile House and at 108 Mile Ranch, suitable for the novice or advanced rider.

## 22. BIGHORN ARCHERY CLUB

The South Cariboo is a destination for those with bows and arrows. The Bighorn Archery Club hosts two shoots a year: a 3D indoor shoot at the Stan Halcro Arena in 100 Mile House in the fall and an outdoor 3D shoot outside in the forest at the 100 Mile House Snowmobile Clubhouse in the summer. Year-round practice is held at the Stan Halcro Agriplex in winter and at an outdoor course during the summer.

## 23. MOTOCROSS

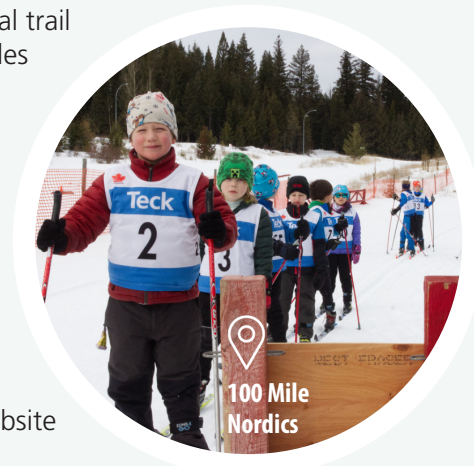
Just up the road from the Huncity Trails at the end of Ainsworth Road is the 100 Mile House Snowmobile Clubhouse. During the summer, the lodge hosts the South Cariboo Track & Trail Dirtbike Association. The association maintains a motocross trail and several kilometres of multipurpose trails for dirtbikes, ATVs and snowmobiles in the winter. The association is also known to host weekend motocross, motorodeo and poker runs during the summer. This year, round four of the 2026 B.C. Outdoor Motocross Championships will be hosted by the association from May 30 to 31st.

## 24. BOWLING

Those looking for a fun indoor activity need look no further than Big Country Lanes. 100 Mile House's bowling alley is typically open throughout the week for drop-in bowling and offers league play during the winter.

## 25. GOLD RUSH SNOWMOBILE TRAIL

Running throughout the South Cariboo and beyond, the Gold Rush Snowmobile Trail is a multi-use recreational trail perfect for snowmobiles and off-road vehicles. The trail is accessible from the 100 Mile House Snowmobile Club Clubhouse and several other access points throughout the area. Be sure to plan your trip and check out Gold Rush Snowmobile Trail's website for more information.



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## 26. FOOD TRUCKS

100 Mile House's culinary community isn't just bound to brick-and-mortar restaurants. Over the last several years, there has been an explosion in the number of food trucks offering everything from fish and chips, gourmet burgers, ice cream and authentic Indian cuisine. These food trucks are common sights at local events and can be found across the South Cariboo during the summer months.

## 27. HEALING FOR OUR CHILDREN POWWOW

Organized by the Tsq̓ésc̓en First Nation's Eliza Archie Early Learning Centre, the third annual Healing for our Children Powwow is scheduled to take place from May 22 to 24 at the South Cariboo Rec Centre. This event is a celebration of the resilience of local First Nations communities and a chance for visitors to experience powwow culture.

## 28. SANTA CLAUS PARADE

Every year in November, the South Cariboo converges on 100 Mile House for the annual Santa Claus Parade. A massive showcase of all the region has to offer, the parade takes place down Birch Avenue with many businesses staying open late to offer some exciting deals. This year, the parade is scheduled for Friday, November 27.

# 108 MILE RANCH

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Located only a few minutes north of 100 Mile House, 108 Mile Ranch is a community rich in natural beauty, history and backyard adventure. Once a vital stop along the Cariboo Waggon Road, today the history of the Cariboo Gold Rush and the pioneers that followed it is kept alive at the 108 Heritage Site. At the same time, the current community enjoys access to a series of beautiful trails and one of British Columbia's largest community green spaces in the 108 Greenbelt.

## 29. 108 HERITAGE SITE

One of 108 Mile Ranch's main attractions is the 108 Mile Heritage Site located just off Highway 97. These 13 historic structures are a living reminder of the South Cariboo's Gold Rush and pioneer history, which visitors can explore at their leisure. Every Saturday from May to September, the site also hosts the 108 Heritage Market with local vendors and artisans gathering to sell a wide range of wares.

## 30. CANADA DAY CELEBRATION

Every year, the 108 Heritage Site is the place to celebrate Canada Day in the South Cariboo. The 100 Mile and District Historical Society, which runs the site, pull out the stops with live music, food and games for all to enjoy. The event typically runs from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on July 1.

## 31. 108 GHOST TOURS

During the fall, a small group of local paranormal investigators come together to run the 108 Mile Ghost Tours. The tour winds its way through the 108 Heritage Site as guides share stories of the many ghosts said to haunt these historic buildings. From Sept. 18 to 20, the 108 Heritage Site this year will also be hosting the Cari-BOO-Con, a paranormal conference for all true believers.

## 32. CKULTENELLCW CULTURAL CENTRE

The Northern Secwepmec people include the Tsq'ésceñ First Nation, the Williams Lake First Nation, the Esk'etemc First Nation, the Stswecem'c Xget'tem First Nation and the Xat'sull First Nation, who all traditionally made the Cariboo their home. They have worked together for 20 years to bring the Ckultenellcw Cultural Centre to life, which means 'Our Culture of Long Ago' in Secwepmec. The centre's goal is to provide the local community and travelling public with a rotating gallery of historic and cultural exhibits taken from each of the participating nations. The Ckultenellcw Cultural Centre is located next door to the 108 Heritage Site.

## 33. 108 LAKE/SEPA LAKE TRAILS

An accessible trail around the 108 Mile Lake offers an easy stroll for those looking to stretch their legs, walk the dog and go birdwatching. The lake can be accessed at the 108 Mile Heritage Site or the 108 Main Beach and is popular for all ages. This seven-kilometre-long loop has an easy grade with 10 benches set up along the route for walkers to rest their feet and take in the view of the lake. For those looking for a longer walk, the lake links with nearby Sepa Lake, about a 10-kilometre round trip.

### 34. 108 GREENBELT

If you're looking to explore beyond the 108 Mile Lake trail, you'll soon find yourself wandering the 108 Greenbelt. Consisting of 1,500 acres of community parklands left as close to their natural state as possible, the greenbelt surrounds the entire 108 subdivision. Walking and pedal biking through the greenbelt are permitted; however, motorized vehicles are prohibited.



### 38. 108 GOLF COURSE

The 108 Golf Resort offers an 18-hole CPGA-rated championship course nestled between two lakes. Starting on the first tee, golfers can experience about 6,800 yards of evergreen, a variety of interesting holes and enjoy the scenic backdrop. The course has seen an uptick in users over the past few years, with more young people joining the fray. Upgrades to the resort have seen the addition of new full-service RV sites and hotel room renovations.

### 35. WALKER VALLEY BIRD WATCHING

If birdwatching is your preference, the Walker Valley within the 108 Greenbelt makes for a perfect day trip. A 6.3 km trail loops around the valley, taking around an hour and a half to two hours to complete. Along the way, especially in the spring and summer, you'll witness a wide variety of birds, including raptors, songbirds and waterfowl.

### 39. 108 DISC GOLF

One of the newest additions to the 108 Mile Ranch is a disc golf course set up at the 108 Mile Lake West Beach. This nine-hole course has a combined par of 27 and makes use of tone poles. A public washroom is available on site.

### 36. 108 COMMUNITY CENTRE

Located just off Highway 97 at 4924 Telqua Drive, the 108 Community Centre serves as a hub for events in the 108 Mile Ranch. The 108 Mile Ranch Community Association, 108 Mile Lions Club and private groups all host events and programs at the centre throughout the year.

### 40. 108 MAIN BEACH

Across the lake, the 108 Mile Greenbelt Commission manages the 108 Main Beach. The beach features a fishing dock for anglers, a gazebo, picnic tables and a public washroom.

### 37. 108 ATV CLUB

For the last few years, the 108 ATV Club has grown into one of the leading voices for outdoor recreation tourism in the South Cariboo. The club runs monthly rides across the region and advocates for safe and environmentally conscious riding. From Thursday, Sept. 10 to Sunday, Sept. 13, the club will host the 2026 ATVBC Jamboree & Annual General Meeting at the 100 Mile House Snowmobile Clubhouse.



# LAC LA HACHE THE LAKE OF THE AXE

---

Lac La Hache (Lake of the Axe) is fondly referred to as the Longest Town in the Cariboo, spread out along 18 kilometres of gorgeous shoreline dotted with a growing number of beautiful homes. Located a half hour up the road from 100 Mile House, Lac La Hache is a haven for those looking for aquatic adventures, its clear waters perfect for swimming, boating and fishing. During the winter, Lac La Hache transforms into a winter wonderland, with the Mount Timothy Recreation Resort serving as a favoured haunt for locals and visitors alike.

#### 41. LAC LA HACHE LAKE

Lac La Hache Lake itself is the perfect place in the summer to go camping, swimming, jet skiing, tubing, power boating, kayaking and fishing.

#### 42. LAC LA HACHE PROVINCIAL PARK

Just 13 kilometres up Highway 97 from Lac La Hache itself is the Lac La Hache Provincial Park. This day-use area features a boat launch, a beach, a changehouse, a sani station, flush toilets, a picnic table and a self-guided nature trail.

#### 43. MOUNT TIMOTHY

Mount Timothy Recreation Resort touts itself as a family-friendly resort, offering some of the most affordable skiing and snowboarding in the province. Youth who aren't ready to ski or need a break can take advantage of a magic carpet and tubing hill while others can take advantage of easy-to-follow snowshoe trails and adventures. The resort, which is open year-round, offers cabin rentals as well as a range of food and refreshments.

#### 44. SOUTH CARIBOO GARLIC FESTIVAL

Lac La Hache's signature event is the annual South Cariboo Garlic Festival. Billed as a 'Stinkin Good Time' by its organizers, this weekend-long celebration of garlic attracts over 100 vendors and thousands of people to the community every August. This year, the festival is set to take place on Aug. 29 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Aug. 30 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., with admission for both days costing only \$5 a person. It is located at the South Cariboo Garlic Festival Grounds just a few kilometres north of Lac La Hache.

#### 45. LAC LA HACHE TOWNSITE

In the Lac La Hache townsite itself, the Cariboo Pioneer Centre puts on several events throughout the year, while the Lac La Hache Thrift Store is a great place to go for some Cariboo deals. Local restaurants and gas stations are also close at hand if you need to refuel your car or yourself.

#### 46. SOCIETY FOR CREATIVE ANACHRONISM

The South Cariboo is known by many names. One of them is the Shire of Coill Mhor. The local chapter of the Society for Creative Anachronism, Coill Mhor, will host the Kingdom of An Tir's ducal war at the Northwood Lodge Resort from June 5 to 7 this year. Anyone with a love of medieval history and combat should consider checking it out.

#### 47. KOKANEE FISHING

Lac La Hache is known as a great place to fish year-round. The lake is especially known for its large Kokanee Salmon but Lake and Rainbow Trout can also be found in its waters. While you can fish from the shore or on the ice during the winter, it is recommended that you take a boat out into the lake for the best results in the summer.

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# FOREST GROVE AND CANIM LAKE

The Forest Grove area is full of pioneering and First Nations history, located to the Northeast of 100 Mile House on Canim Hendrix Lake Road, 21 kilometres from Highway 97. It is the home of the Tsq̓ésceñ First Nation, whose people have made the South Cariboo their home for generations. These communities also give visitors access to several beautiful lakes and provincial parks to explore, including Canim Lake, Mahood Lake and Ruth Lake.

## 48. FOREST GROVE COMMUNITY HALL

Located near the centre of Forest Grove, the Forest Grove Community Hall is the nexus for events of all kinds in Forest Grove. During the spring and summer, it hosts weekly markets, while in the winter, it hosts the Forest Grove Curling Club.

## 49. FOREST GROVE ROD AND GUN CLUB

If you're looking to practice your shooting before going hunting or just to have a little fun with firearms, the Forest Grove Rod and Gun Club has you covered. Located at 4385 Canim-Hendrix Lake Road, the range is open daily to members and guests and hosts a bi-weekly trap shoot meetup at noon on Sundays in the spring, summer and fall. Check their website at [fgrrodandgun.ca](http://fgrrodandgun.ca) for details.

## 50. CANIM LAKE

One of the largest lakes in the South Cariboo, Canim Lake is a picturesque destination surrounded by low rolling mountains, meadows and thick forests. Its shores are home to a large unincorporated community and several resorts. During the summer its an excellent place for watersports of all kinds.

## 51. CANIM BEACH PROVINCIAL PARK

Located on the shores of Canim Lake is the Canim Beach Provincial Park, a six-hectare plot of land for the public to explore. The park's gravel pebble beach provides the public a perfect place to swim, canoe and fish from, while those looking to stretch their legs will find a trail head that leads to Canim Falls.

## 52. CANIM FALLS AND MAHOOD FALLS

Accessible via trailhead, Canim Falls and Mahood Falls are a short, roughly hour-long round trip. These spectacular waterfalls are a favoured spot for fly fishermen or families looking for a challenging but beautiful hike.

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### 53. MAHOOD LAKE

Located just a 20 minute drive from the eastern edge of Canim Lake, Mahood Lake is unique in Wells Gray Provincial Park for being the only lake not fed by glaciers. This means during the summer, it gets warm enough for swimming. Mahood Lake shines, however, as a fishing destination with Kokanee, Whitefish, Burbot, Rainbow Trout and Lake Trout all found within its waters.

### 54. WELLS GRAY PROVINCIAL PARK

While its primary access point is located outside the Cariboo in nearby Clearwater, Wells Gray Provincial Park extends northwest into the Forest Grove area. Several recreation sites are located around the Mahood Lake area, which you can visit while enjoying the natural splendour of the area.

### 55. RUTH LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK

Another perfect day trip for visitors looking to take it easy is Ruth Lake Provincial Park. A relatively small day-use park, the park features a grassy space for picnicking and a small beach, with the rest of the park consisting primarily of undeveloped forest. A boat launch, picnic area and washroom are all on site.

### 56. SCHOOLHOUSE LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK

Anyone looking to rough it on their vacation is encouraged to check out Schoolhouse Lake Provincial Park. Located near Canim Lake, camping is allowed in the park, but there are no facilities available. Fishing, hunting and campfires are permitted, so long as proper hunting licenses are obtained and no fire bans are in effect.

### 57. HOWARD LAKE PARK

South of Canim Lake, you'll find Howard Lake Park. Maintained by the B.C. government, the park has space for 32 campsites for a daily camping fee. The site includes several picnic tables, toilets and a boat launch onto Howard Lake itself. Boaters should be aware that the maximum engine power allowed on this lake is 7.45 kilowatts (10hp).

### 58. 100 MILE HORSEPOWER RANCH

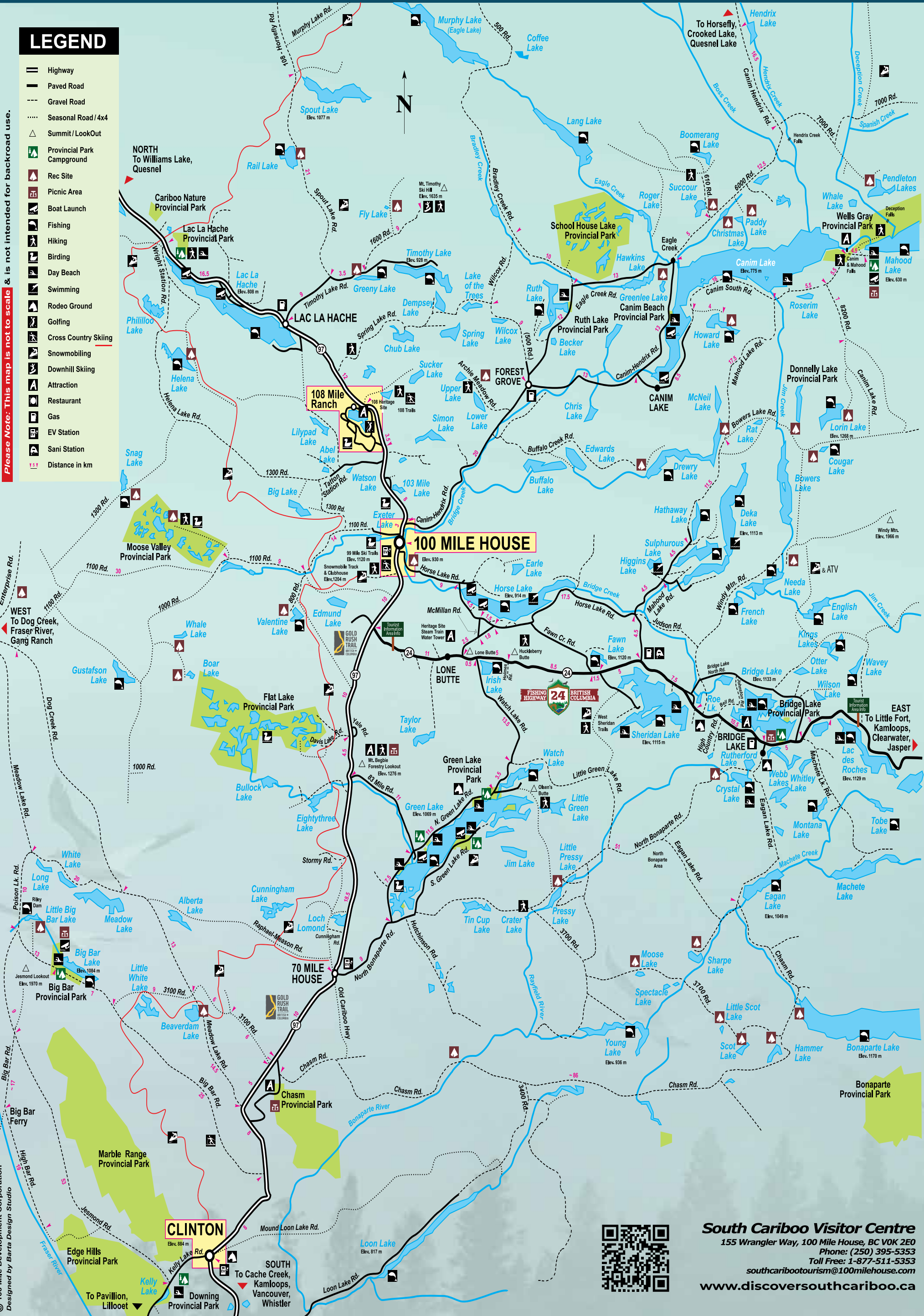
Getting to 100 Mile Horsepower Ranch is something of an adventure, but well worth it if you're a fan of high-octane racing and daring stunts. The ranch teams up with the Northwest Mud Racing Association to run two major events in the summer, the Mud Drags, scheduled for Aug. 14 to 16 this year, and the Backforty Beatdown from Sept. 18 to 20. Racers compete in several different courses using off road vehicles, mega trucks, rock bouncers, buggies and tough trucks.

### 59. MICA MOUNTAIN RIDERS

One of the South Cariboo's best secrets is Mica Mountain. Located east of Hendrix Lake, Mica Mountain is maintained by the Mica Mountain Riders Association, who maintain the road leading to the mountain and uses it for snowmobile rides. The mountain's breathtaking scenery, especially during the winter months, is well worth the drive.

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# INTERLAKES

The stretch of communities and lakes between Lone Butte and Lac Des Roches along Highway 24, around 40 minutes from 100 Mile House, is referred to as the Interlakes. These tight-knit communities are built around the lakes they derive their names from and support several thriving resorts. Communities within the Interlakes include Deka Lake, Bridge Lake and Sheridan Lake. Highway 24 is also known as the Fishing Highway for the 100 lakes scattered alongside it, stocked with a wide variety of fish. Beyond fishing, the area invites hiking, horseback riding, wildlife viewing and relaxed drives, making the Interlakes a destination for those looking for a serene adventure along the South Cariboo's lakes and trails.

## 60. INTERLAKES COMMUNITY CENTRE

The heart of the Interlakes community, the Interlakes Community Centre (ICC) is a hub for community events, big and small. Throughout the year, the ICC hosts bingo, yoga classes, bridge lessons and dances, in addition to several large community events. It also features a playground for children who need to burn off some energy.

## 61. BRIDGE LAKE FAIR

For over 65 years, residents of the Interlakes have come together to participate in the Bridge Lake Fair. A classic country fair held at the Interlakes Community Centre and Roe Lake Rodeo grounds, the fair features exhibit judging, zucchini races, cattle dog demonstrations and other fun events. This year's fair is scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 15.

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## 62. INTERLAKES RODEO

Just a few minutes' walk away from the Interlakes Community Centre lies the Roe Lake Rodeo Grounds. Every August long weekend, the grounds host the annual Interlakes Rodeo, a British Columbia Rodeo Association-sanctioned event. The rodeo features bull riding, wild horse races, team roping, barrel racing and a wide variety of other classic rodeo events.

## 63. BRIDGE LAKE ICE CAVES

Located along Highway 24 the unique geology of Bridge Lake's shoreline features caves and crevices sheltered from the elements. Melting snow seeps through the rock crevices into the caves where it freezes, creating a year-round supply of ice that was originally used by First Nations and later by early settlers in the area.

Four trails of varying degrees of difficulty wind through the park to observation platforms overlooking the lake from above the caves, making them safe for visitors of all ages. Visitors are strongly discouraged from trying to enter the caves below.

The Low Mobility Wolf Trail is just 500 metres long and begins at the parking lot and makes its way to the viewing platforms, one of which is wheelchair accessible. Those looking for more of a challenge can continue on from the end of the Wolf Trail onto the Beaver Trail, which hugs the lakeshore, or the Owl Trail to head back to the parking lot, which is hard and well-packed like the Wolf Trail.

A dock provides a spot for shoreline fishing and is easily accessible from Beaver Trail. Facilities also include a picnic area near the ice caves and resting benches. There is one bathroom located beside the parking lot.

## 64. BRIDGE LAKE STAMPEDE

For several decades now, members of the Bridge Lake community have gathered at the Bridge Lake Stampede Grounds each summer for a day of exciting rodeo action and a barnyard dance. Typically held the weekend after Canada Day, this stampede is a great chance to see real working cowboys compete in a wide variety of western events.

## 65. DEKA LAKE

A sleepy retirement community, Deka Lake takes a little while to get to, but is well worth the drive. This 14-kilometre-long lake features several bed and breakfasts in addition to numerous boat launches maintained by the Deka Lake Ratepayers' Association.

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## 66. MOUNTAIN SPRUCE COMMUNITY CENTRE

While it's located off the beaten path, the trails maintained by the Mountain Spruce Community Centre are well worth the visit. This 11-acre property is located near Hathaway, Sulphurous, Deka and Higgins Lakes and features accessible trails maintained by the local community.

The park features a specifically fenced-off picnic area for day visitors and a bridge which gives people access to a perimeter trail. Visitors can choose to embark on either a 400-metre or one-kilometre-long loop. The Mountain Spruce Community Park is located within a wetlands and is an excellent place to go birdwatching during the summer months. The park is located at 6335 Mahood Lake Road, about a half-hour east of 100 Mile House towards the community of Deka Lake.



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## 67. FISHING HIGHWAY

Highway 24's official nickname is the Fishing Highway, a moniker it more than lives up to. Between the Highway 97 turnoff and Little Fort, there are approximately 100 lakes of all shapes and sizes, a veritable dream for anglers of all ages and experience levels. Over the last several years, many of these lakes have received new public fishing docks to improve lake access, including Irish Lake, Bridge Lake, Hathaway Lake, Crystal Lake, Higgins Lake and Phinetta Lake.

## 68. RESORTS

Nestled on the shores of the Fishing Highway's many beautiful lakes is a wide variety of resorts, dude ranches and campgrounds for visitors to enjoy. If you're looking to unwind, disconnect from the modern world and maybe do a little bit of fishing, you should consider making one of these establishments your home base.

## 69. INTERLAKES PIONEER TRAIL

Just a few minutes away from the Bridge Lake Ice Caves on Highway 24, the Interlakes Pioneer Heritage Trail is a short but picturesque route beside the Interlakes Community Centre at 7592 Highway 24. At one kilometre long, this trail is a perfect chance to get out and stretch your legs on a crushed gravel surface.

Picnic tables, benches and an accessible outhouse have been set up along the trail for the public's convenience. The trail ends at the Roe Lake Rodeo Grounds.

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# LONE BUTTE & HORSE LAKE

Lone Butte and Horse Lake, located 10 kilometres east of Highway 97 along Highway 24, is a charming rural community with a long history. While many of its historic buildings are lost to time, the community is dedicated to keeping its history alive.

## 70. LONE BUTTE

A historic railway stop, Lone Butte had the highest elevation on the Pacific Great Eastern Railway line and still retains a glimmer of its former glory days. Shops and a café can be found within the town as well as a gas station for those travelling on Highway 24.

## 71. LONE BUTTE ROCKS

Every summer, Lone Butte comes alive for Lone Butte Rocks, organized by the Lone Butte Community Association and the Lone Butte Historical Association. Scheduled for Sunday, July 12 this year, Lone Butte Rocks features carnival games, a tractor ride, equestrian demonstrations and local craft vendors, all free for the community to enjoy.

## 72. WATER TOWER PARK

Maintained by the Lone Butte Historical Association, Water Tower Park is one of the last remnants of Lone Butte's rich history. The caboose on site contains a small museum filled with photos and stories of Lone Butte in its heyday, while washrooms and picnic tables on site give motorists a place to stretch their legs. During community events, like Lone Butte Rocks, the water tower itself is opened to the public.

## 73. ALICE SINGLETON HERITAGE HOUSE

The Lone Butte Historical Association also operates the nearby Alice Singleton Heritage House as a small historic site. Since the 1940s, the house has served as a church, the first Red Cross Outpost Hospital in the South Cariboo and as a Canada Post Office from the 1960s to 1970s, complete with an old Cold War fallout shelter. This summer, the association also plans to open up the newly relocated Willowford School #3, a historic single-room schoolhouse.



## 74. CLIMBING THE BUTTE

Lone Butte's name is derived from the butte itself, a towering volcanic plug left behind by the glacier. Just before you leave the town, there is a small turnoff which leads to a trailhead for those looking to climb to the top of the butte. After less than 10 minutes, you'll find yourself with a commanding view of Lone Butte and the South Cariboo as a whole. While a fun climb, please note that this climb is steep going up and down and may not be suitable for those with low mobility.

## 75. OUTHOUSE RACES

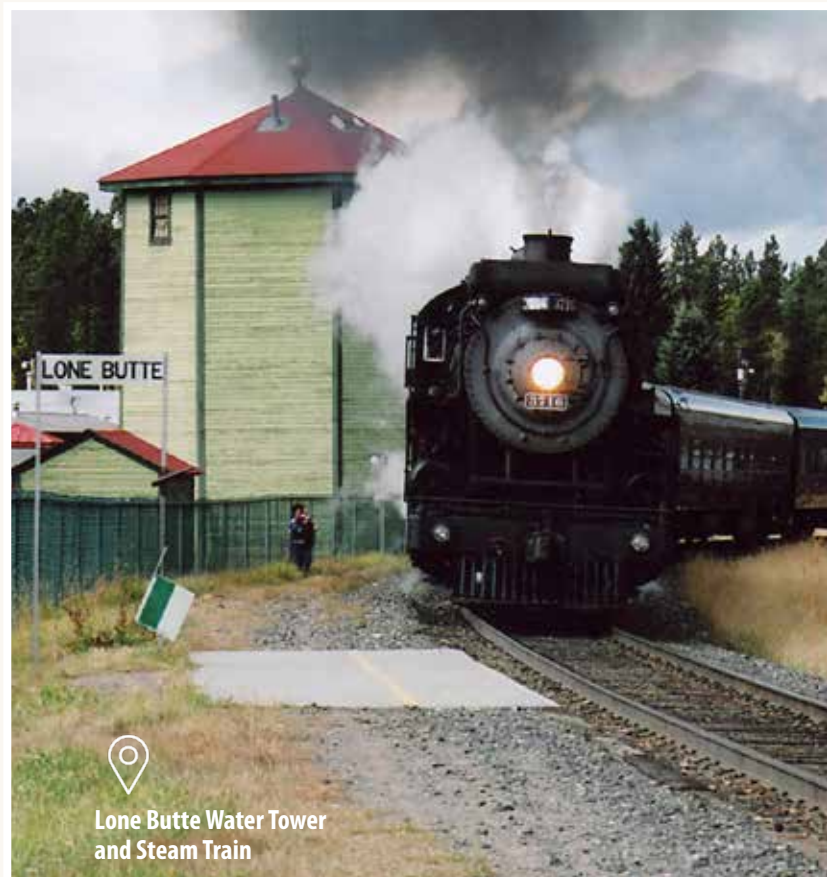
Every Family Day Long Weekend, the Iron Horse Pub in Lone Butte plays host to the Fishing Highway 24 Tourist Association's Outhouse Races. Typically held on the Sunday, this event brings participants from across the South Cariboo.

## 76. HORSE LAKE

A popular holiday spot located within easy driving distance of Lone Butte and 100 Mile House, Horse Lake is an 18-kilometre-long lake bordered by resorts, campgrounds and private homes. The lake is regularly stocked with Lake Trout, Kokanee and Rainbow Trout and is a popular ice fishing spot during the winter.

## 77. HORSE LAKE COMMUNITY FARM CO-OP

Located at the eastern end of Horse Lake is the Horse Lake Community Farm Co-Op, a 13-acre heritage farm preserved and maintained by local farmers and concerned citizens. Throughout the year, the co-op hosts community events where they invite the public onto the farm, though they also welcome anyone looking to volunteer their time to reach out to them.

# 70 MILE HOUSE GREEN LAKE WATCH LAKE

**Located about a half hour drive south of 100 Mile House is the tranquil community of 70 Mile House.**

**Laid back and tight-knit, in recent years, 70 Mile House has begun to transform from a primarily ranching and logging community to a retirement and tourism hub.**

**Featuring a gas station, a general store and a few local restaurants, 70 Mile House always welcomes visitors, whether they're staying for a while or passing through. 70 Mile House also serves as the gateway to the communities of Green Lake and Watch Lake, known for their natural beauty.**

**Nearby attractions include the beauty of Painted Chasm and the commanding view of Begbie Summit.**

## 78. CARRIAGE RACING

The age of the horse buggy isn't quite gone from the South Cariboo thanks to the Cariboo Country Carriage Club and Huber Farms and Equestrian Centre. Located right off Highway 97 in the heart of 70 Mile House, Huber Farms plays host to several carriage racing events throughout the year. This year, they'll be hosting the BS and Drive race from May 16 to May 17, followed by their Field Driving Trials in September.

## 79. 70 MILE COMMUNITY HALL/RIDING GROUNDS

Maintained by the 70 Mile Community Club, the 70 Mile House Community Hall hosts several events throughout the year. The club's recently restored riding arena, right behind the hall, meanwhile, has revitalized equestrian activity in the area. The club currently plans to host a ranch riding clinic from May 8-10 and a Horses That Work Clinic from Aug. 7 to 9.

## 80. SEVENTY MILE ACCESS CENTRE

One of 70 Mile House's most unique features is the Seventy Mile Access Centre (SMAC). A former elementary school, SMAC has since been converted into a massive thrift store with books, clothing, toys and household items all for sale. If you're looking to do a little thrifting or replace a forgotten piece of gear, check out SMAC located at 2545 North Bonaparte Road.

## 81. GREEN LAKE

Located 13 kilometres from 70 Mile House, Green Lake is a stunning lake 14 kilometres long, which makes it one of the largest in the South Cariboo. Its Caribbean blue/green colouration comes from calcium carbonate present in the water. The lake provides excellent opportunities for swimming, fishing, boating and other water sports activities.

## 82. GREEN LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK

If you're looking to camp out on the shores of Green Lake, Green Lake Provincial Park offers you several opportunities for recreation. Campsites with developed facilities include Arrowhead, Blue Spring, Emerald Bay, Little Arrowhead, and Sunset View. Meanwhile, sites such as Boyd Bay, Black Bear, Buckside Hill, Green Lake Islands, and Nolan Creek are less developed and are intended to conserve nature.

### 83. WATCH LAKE

A little further north of Green Lake is Watch Lake, which is popular with anglers, especially fly fishermen. Watch Lake is stocked with thousands of Rainbow Trout annually and is perfect for those looking to experience a more laid-back Cariboo experience.

### 84. WATCH LAKE GYMKHANA

In addition to fishing, Watch Lake is also known for its annual gymkhanas. Similar to a rodeo, the Watch Lake Gymkhana sees local ranchers and horse riders showing off their riding and racing skills at the Watch Lake Gymkhana Grounds. This year, the gymkhanas are taking place on July 11 and August 8.

### 85. WATCH LAKE LODGE

If you're looking for a place to stay on Watch Lake with a rich history, the Watch Lake Lodge is the place for you. In 2025, this rustic and charming lodge celebrated 75 years of local family ownership. Beyond relaxing by the lakeside, there are also horseback riding opportunities at this site.

## 86. GREEN LAKE TRAIL SYSTEM

A trail system suitable for walking in the summer and snowshoeing in the winter extends around large parts of Green Lake. This trail system is accessible from both 70 Mile House and Green Lake and is maintained by the Green Lake Community Centre and Outdoor Recreation Society.

## 87. MOUNT BEGBIE LOOKOUT

Mount Begbie is located 10 kilometres south of 100 Mile House just off Highway 97 and offers excellent views of the surrounding area. The lookout was originally a wildfire lookout tower built in the 1970s. There are two routes up to the tower, including a short but somewhat steep footpath from the highway rest stop, which features picnic tables and a washroom, or by walking along a service road which goes around the summit.

## 88. PAINTED CHASM

Painted Chasm is a bedrock box canyon located just nine kilometres south of 70 Mile House. Simply go down Highway 97, turn left onto Chasm Road and follow it for three kilometres. Facilities include a large pull-out, educational signboards and outhouses. Painted Chasm gets its name from ancient lava flows layered atop one another that have been exposed by erosion, creating a unique blend of colours.



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# CLINTON

---

Located at the southernmost edge of the South Cariboo, 72 kilometres south of 100 Mile House, Clinton is a friendly community that embraces its natural beauty and heritage in equal measures. Sitting at the base of the scenic limestone marble range, Clinton is an idyllic town surrounded by rolling pastures and green foothills. The quiet and laid-back pace of life in Clinton is the perfect complement to many outdoor adventures found beyond town limits, with fishing opportunities, gravel biking, hiking, and horseback rides all within reach.

## 89. CLINTON TOWNSITE

A sleepy community built along Highway 97, there's more to Clinton than first meets the eye. Accommodations include motels, guest ranches, and campgrounds/RV parks. Businesses include grocery stores, convenience stores, a hardware store, gas stations, restaurants, an auto mechanic, a liquor store, gift shops, as well as an RCMP station, post office, library, and credit union. There is also an off-leash dog park on Cariboo Avenue, just off Highway 97 at the south end of town.

## 90. CLINTON MAY BALL

Canada's longest-running social event takes place every May in Clinton. For 159 years, generations of Clintonites have organized the ball, which encourages attendees to dress formally and dance the night away. This year's ball is scheduled for May 16 at the Clinton Memorial Hall.

## 91. CLINTON MAY BALL RODEO

While it is not quite as venerable as the Clinton May Ball, the Clinton May Ball Rodeo has been running for 75 years in May. This British Columbia Rodeo Association sanctioned event is set to run from May 22nd to 24th this year.

## 92. CLINTON MUSEUM

The Clinton Museum opened in 1956 and holds a variety of antiques, photos, and historical papers that will take the visitor back to Clinton's earliest days. The building was constructed of local brick in 1892 and served as a school and courthouse before becoming the museum. Browse the exhibits in the museum, then go outside and check out the variety of vintage vehicles between the museum and the historic livery stable, which houses even more artifacts.

## 93. REG CONN CENTENNIAL PARK

A wonderful place for families to visit is Reg Conn Centennial Park, a five-acre treasure within the village of Clinton. Have a quiet picnic beside the bubbling creek and stretch those legs before hitting the road again. There is lots of green space for the children to run in, as well as a playground, with new equipment installed in 2024. The park is the place to be on special holidays like Canada Day, and often on weekends when community activities such as Music in the Park nights are arranged.

## 94. HISTORIC WALKING TOUR

Take a literal step back in time with the “Historic Walking Tour” guidebook. The guide has photographs and write-ups about 25 historic and significant sites and buildings in and around Clinton, including the historic Clinton Pioneer Cemetery, and provides a fascinating look at the town’s history. Visitors can start the tour at any point and do as much or as little as time allows. Copies of the guide are available at the museum, the village office, and many local businesses.

## 95. CLINTON OUTDOOR MARKET

There is an outdoor market in Clinton every Sunday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. through the summer outside of Hunnie’s Mercantile on Highway 97. Stop by and browse the homemade baked goods, local preserves and honey, arts and crafts, and secondhand treasures.

## 96. CLINTON ARTS

Clinton has a vibrant music scene, anchored and promoted by local talent including Dustin Bentall, Jamielynn Caswell, Tracy Fallstrom, Bruce Ambler, Arlen Park, and the Blue Wranglers. Bluegrass music is a specialty of many artists, who often invite locals to take part in concerts held at Reg Conn Park in summer. The Clinton Country Artists hold an art show and sale every summer, as does the Clinton Art and Cultural Society, and local artwork — from paintings and wood carvings to jewellery and ceramics — can be found at several local shops.

## 97. CLINTON ANTIQUES

Clinton boasts many places where collectors can browse for unique memorabilia and vintage items. Are you looking for a one-of-a-kind treasure, a special keepsake, or the perfect gift? There’s something for everyone, and every taste, in Clinton.

## 98. CLINTON OUTDOORS

There are plenty of opportunities for outdoor adventures in and around Clinton, from a well-marked trail network to nearby provincial parks. Recreation opportunities include hiking, cross-country ski and snowmobile trails, fishing and recreational lakes, a baseball diamond, cycling/walking path, and a pump track at Elliott Park on Kelly Lake Road, the Reg Conn Centennial Park for picnicking, tennis courts, an arena, and a curling rink.

## 99. HISTORIC HAT CREEK RANCH

While it is located just outside of the South Cariboo proper, Historic Hat Creek Ranch is well worth a visit if you'd like to learn more about the Cariboo Gold Rush. Now operated by the St'uxwtéws First Nation, the ranch features several heritage buildings from the gold rush days, interpretive indigenous exhibits, a campground and easy access to the nearby fossil beds, also operated by St'uxwtéws. If you're staying in Clinton, it is certainly worth a day trip.

## 100. HORSEBACK RIDING

Trekking by horseback remains one of the most popular ways to explore the South Cariboo region, which has an abundance of guest and working ranches offering an authentic western riding experience in Clinton and beyond. About 20 ranches in the area offer everything from family-friendly, low-impact trail rides to multi-hour saddle treks through rolling grasslands, sagebrush-covered vistas and more. No matter what your wild west dream is, you can count on the experts to match the right horse to its rider.

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

## 100 MILE HOUSE

In 100 Mile House, there are three main charging locations for electrical vehicle. The first is two DC Fast Chargers operated by BC Hydro at the South Cariboo Visitor's Centre parking lot. The second is a charging station installed at the 100 Mile House Chevron. Finally, there are two Level Two Charging Stations operated by the District of 100 Mile House at the Cariboo Mall. The cost to charge is \$2 an hour.

## 70 MILE HOUSE

In 70 Mile House, a publicly available EV charging station is located right beside the 70 Mile House Canada Post Office on 70 Mile Frontage Road.

## CLINTON

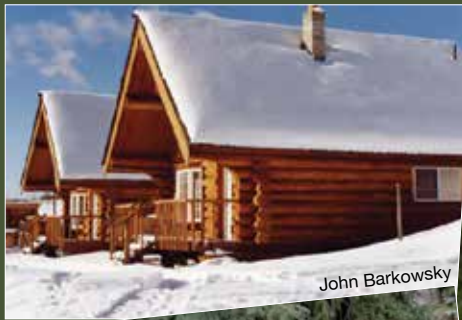
Clinton hosts two BC Hydro EV charging stations set up beside the Village of Clinton's office at 1423 Cariboo Highway.

## HIGHWAY 24

The Interlakes' only EV charging station can be found at the Wettstone Guest Ranch, located just off Highway 24 at the end of Henley Lake Ranch Road. While you charge your vehicle, you'll have a gorgeous view of nearby Henley Lake.

## DEKA LAKE

In the Deka Lake area, you can charge your vehicle at Moosehaven Resort and Campground on Hathaway Lake. Moosehaven is the only resort in the area with 50 AMP electrical unit capable of charging EVs. However, please note that you must bring and provide your own 50-AMP adapter to charge your vehicle at this site.

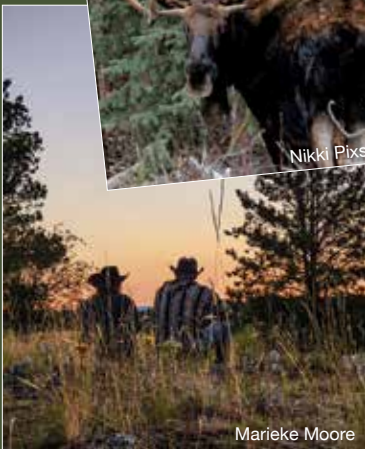


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
